The D of E is an internationally recognised award that is highly valued by employers and educators, and which involves young people helping their community, becoming fitter, developing new skills, and planning, training for and completing expeditions. D of E students develop essential skills for life and work such as teamwork, communication, self-esteem, confidence, problem-solving and resilience. Gaining the award at any level significantly enhances CVs and university and job applications.

The exhibition also asks questions about the modern world and reinforces our school values of dignity and respect. Each group also got the opportunity to visit the Walker Art Gallery which houses various pieces of art ranging from 19th/20th century to modern day. Students enjoyed looking at and discussing these pieces and interacting with the displays. We had a wonderful time, and the students were brilliant.

Year 10 Trip to Cheshire College


The Year 10 students went on a trip to Cheshire college. Here they tried different courses from Construction to Hair and Beauty. They were a credit to the school.


