# Inspired & Enriched

When you join The Bishops' High School Sixth Form, you are also committing to the enrichment and support programme that we offer all our students. The next two years of study are vital in ensuring that you are in the best possible position from which to begin the rest of your life.

We know that our A-Levels and Level 3 courses provide the high academic standards you require to enter further study or employment. We also aim to **inspire** you and provide opportunities to develop leadership and teamwork skills beyond your courses; skills that universities and employers want to see in applications. Together, these two elements of your learning prepare you for a career through gaining experiences of leadership, initiative, resilience and communication in a context other than your A-Level courses.


The enrichment programme is delivered through tutor time and dedicated personal development lessons and we consider it to be a key part of our Sixth Form provision. Many of our students complete **peer support** electives and are positive role models to younger students by offering support in both reading and numeracy. This enables them to acquire skills in leadership, communication and teaching. An increasing number of students are also electing to develop their passions through programmes such as the Sports Leadership Programme with the PE department, Silver Duke of Edinburgh's Award or use their time to undertake sustained work experience to support their future applications. We are always looking to add to our enrichment programme to expand the opportunities available.

When you join our Sixth Form you will utilise our **Quality in Careers accreditation** and complete elective volunteering or work experience placements in order to enhance your experience and develop employability skills.

# Student Leadership

Giving you opportunities to develop your **leadership** skills is a key focus within the Sixth Form. Supporting school wide events and applying to join our Sixth Form Leadership Team taking on the roles of Head Boy, Head Girl or joining the Social Committee, Pastoral Committee, or Charity Committee. We recognise that giving these opportunities and responsibilities develops your character, builds your confidence and gives you additional skills to support future applications.

As Sixth Form Leaders you are not only developing your skills but acting as role models across the school and inspiring younger students to develop their own passions and talents. 
# Support and Welfare

We recognise that the pressures of education can affect students differently. Within the Bishops' Sixth Form we take your wellbeing seriously and have systems in place to support you. We have a dedicated Pastoral Support Officer, Miss Youdale, who is available throughout the day to listen, guide and signpost students with all manner of concerns. We operate an 'Open Door' policy in the Sixth Form where students can call into the office at any time to speak to us and all students have a Form Tutor who they see on a daily basis.

We have a Sixth Form Wellbeing hub which you can use as a space to relax, have some downtime and re-focus. Members of our Sixth Form team are trained Mental Health First Aiders and we also have students who have completed a mental health peer support programme.

Starting on new courses can be a challenge, and our Subject Ambassador programme is designed to give Year 12 students people they can go to in Year 13 aside from the subject teachers.






### **Destinations**

At Bishops' we don't just teach courses - we develop confident, interesting young adults ready for the next stage of life. Our ethos and values shape everything we do, ensuring every student is known, supported and challenged to achieve their best.

This summer's results speak for themselves: outstanding grades across A Levels and Level 3 BTECs, with 75% of BTEC awards at D\*/D (equivalent to A\*/A). These achievements open doors to first-choice destinations - from top universities such as Durham, Nottingham and Lancaster to prestigious degree-level apprenticeships.

Ofsted praised our "meticulous checks, advice and support" that help students thrive. We're passionate about giving you the opportunity to secure your chosen path - and our record proves it.

### **Facilities**

Our purpose built **Sixth Form block** helps to create a real sense of identity for our students. We are blessed to have some of the best facilities in the school dedicated solely for Sixth Form use.

Our **silent study** area, complete with a suite of workstations, offers a calm working environment for students to learn independently.


Our **wellbeing hub** provides space where students can take some time out to reset and enjoy some downtime when needed.

We have dedicated Sixth Form **teaching spaces** both within the Sixth Form block and dotted around the campus. Students can take advantage of these outside of their timetabled lessons to continue to work on assignments and practical projects.

Our **Bistro** is open all day for Sixth Form students and provides a welcoming place to study and socialise over coffee and pastries. Students have exclusive access to the Huddle at lunchtime.

We have site-wide **Wi-Fi** so you can work on your own devices, or on one of our Sixth Form laptops, throughout the campus.

Students also take advantage of our dedicated **careers advice and guidance** provision as well as the UniFrog platform to explore post-18 opportunities at universities, apprenticeships and in employment.



# Joining Our Sixth Form

Our Sixth Form comprises around 200 students and we are delighted to welcome those who chose to join us from other neighbouring schools—you will quickly become part of our community.

The entry requirements are the same for students on roll at the school and external applicants.

#### **Entry Requirements**

Minimum requirements:

A 9-4 grade in GCSE English

A 9-4 grade in GCSE Mathematics

A 9-4 grade in three other GCSE courses

#### **Course Requirements**

Meeting the recommended entry requirements for three courses (usually a grade5/6). These are clearly stated in the accompanying course guide along with further information about what you will be studying.

It is important to us that students are on the right courses in order to be successful over their Sixth Form journey— to this end we place a high importance on supporting students in their course choices.

#### **Applications**

#### **Bursaries**

Entrants to Sixth Form can apply for means tested bursary funding to assist with costs related to a student's studies following their enrolment. This support is awarded based on household income and is assessed and amended annually.
